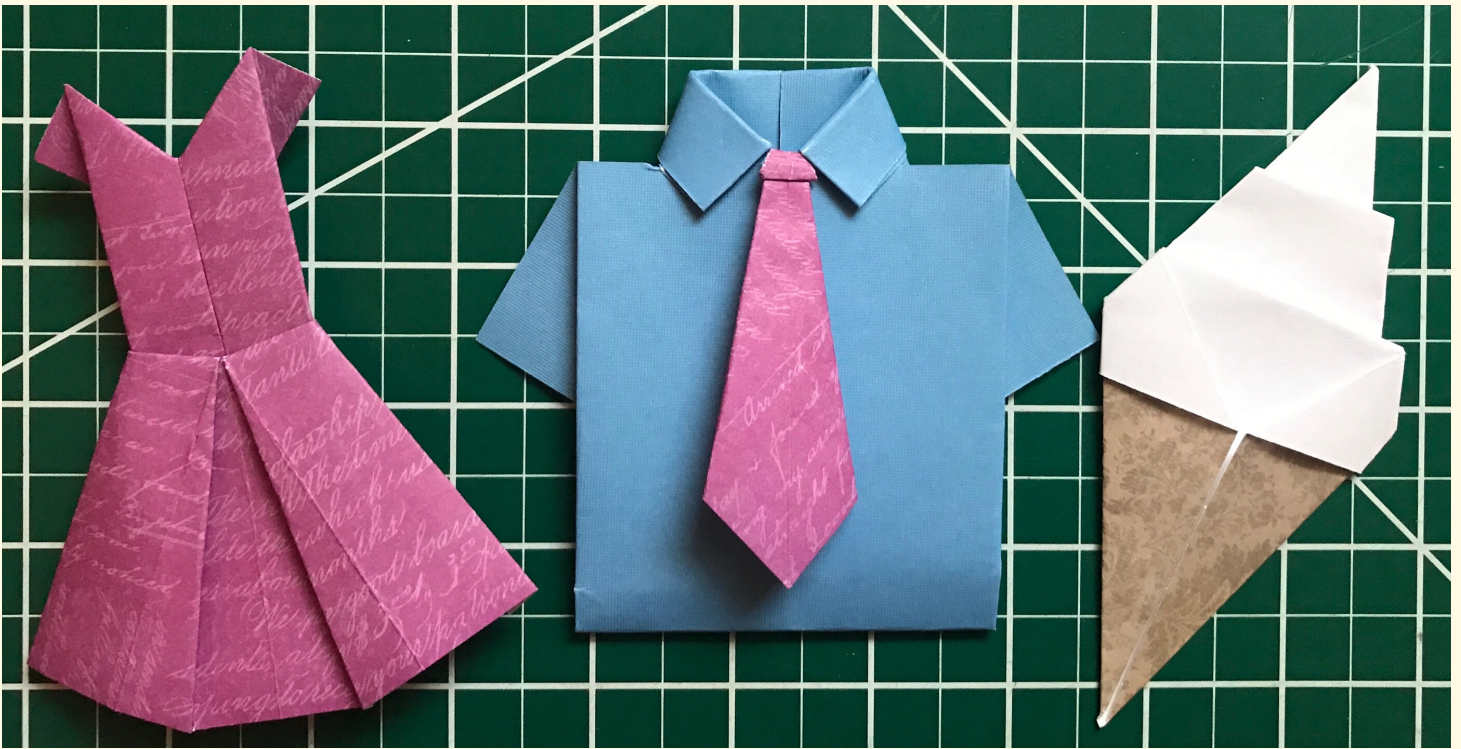

Easy Origami



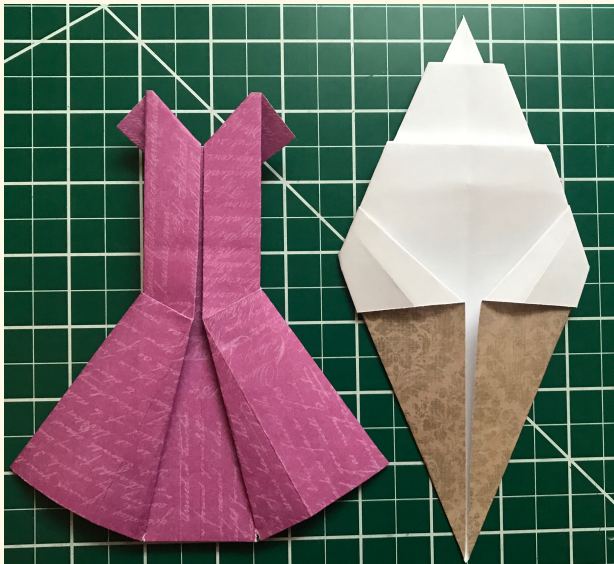
I made this dress, shirt with tie, and ice cream cone using the step by step instructions in this week's book selection [Origami: Classic Paper Folding](#).

Origami Tips

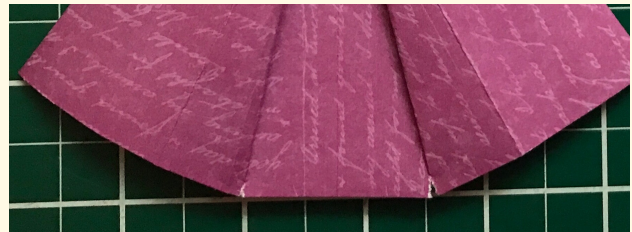
- Thin paper works best including wrapping paper
- Start with the first ones in the book
- For most you pick the size of your square, start big: use computer paper and cut one side so it's an 8.5 inch square
- Then make them smaller when you have the folds down
- If you get stuck look at the next steps and make sure you read all the words in each direction
