In addition to an annual operating budget of \$4 million, it has a \$2.3 million trust. - Provides leadership in the delivery of outstanding service by modeling excellent, innovative, equitable, and inclusive customer-directed service
- Trains, mentors, schedules, and directs professional and paraprofessional staff.
 Provides coaching and corrective action as necessary for staff at all levels.
 Conducts performance reviews.
- Interviews, selects, and develops new staff.
- Promotes Library services through programming, outreach, and partnerships within the community. Represents the Library at meetings and community events
- Works on the Adult Services reference desk providing reference and readers advisory service in person, over the phone, and via electronic delivery
- Develops, plans, implements, and facilitates Library programs, including technology instruction classes and book discussions
- Develops, documents, and implements operating procedures for Library staff
- Responds to patron suggestions, comments and complaints in a timely, professional, and constructive manner
- Prepares for emergencies and helps maintain a safe work environment
- Tracks departmental budget and compiles statistics
- Provides input to annual budget requests and monitors expenditures for materials and programs
- Works cooperatively with the Management Team to provide effective Library services that support the <u>Library's strategic plan and goals</u>
- Maintains departmental web pages and contributes to the monthly Learn.Connect.Discover newsletter and social media accounts
- Conducts all work through a lens of diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Maintains awareness of new developments and trends in the field through professional journals, workshops, conferences, etc.
- Other duties as assigned
