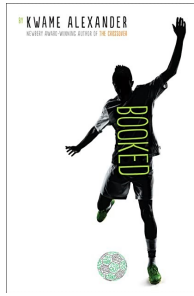


Booked / Kwame Alexander

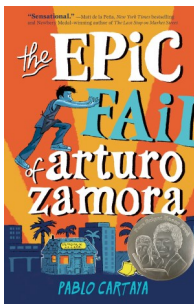
After her best friend dies in a drowning accident, Suzy is convinced that the true cause of the tragedy must have been a rare jellyfish sting.

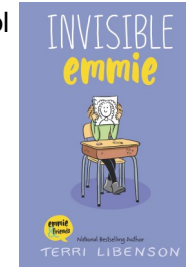
Jackson Greene is saving the school -- one con at a time.

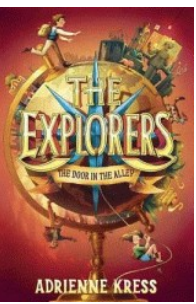
From very different worlds, June and Day have no reason to cross paths - until the day June's brother, Metias, is murdered and Day becomes the prime suspect.

Y FICTION NIELSEN

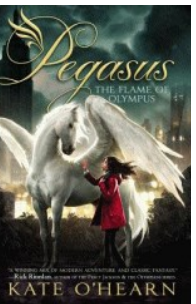

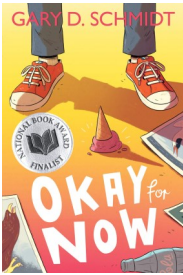
Amal Unbound / Aisha Saeed

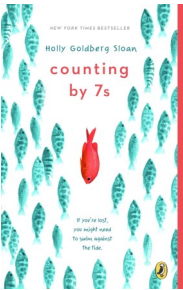
Okay for Now / Gary D. Schmidt

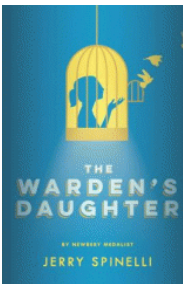
Counting by 7s / Holly Goldberg Sloan

Twelve-year-old genius and outsider Willow Chance must figure out how to connect with other people and find a surrogate family for herself after her parents are killed in a car accident.



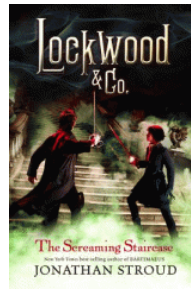
The Warden's Daughter / Jerry Spinelli

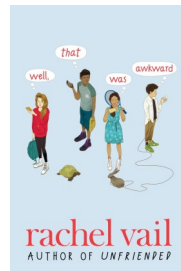
The Menagerie / Tui Sutherland

Y FICTION YEH

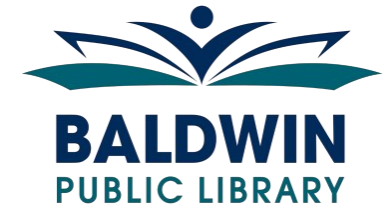
